Kate says her job is simple, to help feed the Hungry of Manchester New Hampshire. She is a member of a collaborative that operates the NH food pantry, and she volunteers in the greenhouse which provides food for that Pantry. Not only is she a volunteer - she was a key player in getting the greenhouse donated and structuring this program. There was a vacant lot next to the pantry. Kate and another volunteer with greenhouse connections began to dream. Kate was a former teacher and really wanted to find a way to bring kids - students - into the project. She began going to her former school to talk about the Hunger Project and working with the students to grow plants from seed, maintain vermiculture compost bins, and even host small hydroponic gardens.

"The only stressful part of the job is pest management. You have to be two steps ahead of those little critters that would love to destroy your crops." I grew up on an lowa farm working the land to help feed my family and I still get to do it here in this urban environment.
